(b) Appointment of Committees – Executive Advisory Boards

The Executive Advisory Boards (EABs) were established in 2015 and their terms of reference were originally aligned to themes in the then Corporate Plan. Latterly, their terms of reference have been linked to the corporate management structure of the Council. Their current terms of reference are based on the previous management structure, prior to the collaboration with Waverley Borough Council.

It is proposed to simplify their terms of reference so that they align with the current Joint Management Team structure.

It is proposed that the Service Delivery EAB is re-named the "Community EAB" and should cover the following service areas:

- Communications and Customer Services
- Community Services
- Environmental Services
- Housing Services
- Regulatory Services
- Commercial Services

It is also proposed that the Strategy & Resources EAB is re-named the "Resources EAB" and should cover the following service areas:

- Planning Development
- Regeneration and Planning Policy
- Assets
- Finance
- Legal & Democratic Services
- Organisational Development

Subject to the Council's approval, appropriate amendments will be made to the EABs' terms of reference in the Constitution.

(h) Councillor Champions – Summary of Activities 2022-23

Armed Forces Champion - Councillor Tom Hunt

"In 2022, the Council commemorated Armed Forces Day, Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday. I participated in these services, and along with the Mayor, the Leader, and the Chief Executive, laid a wreath at the war memorial on Remembrance Sunday.

I continue to chair the Community Covenant Panel, held at Army Training Centre (Pirbright) three times a year. I also participate in county-wide fora, including the Recognise and Remember Task Force. ATC(P) is in the early stages of some significant redevelopment plans, with the objective of creating the British Army Soldier Academy at Pirbright. Along with the Strategic Director of Place, I attended a briefing session involving both the Defence Infrastructure Organisation and senior officers from Army HQ to be appraised of these plans.

Illness sadly prevented me from attending this year's Surrey Armed Forces Covenant Conference, but GBC officers were in attendance. I am told that one of the highlights was a keynote speech from Johnson Beharry VC.

Finally, I continue to deal with queries and requests from residents and councillors relating to armed forces matters, including supporting local veterans."

Historic Environment and Design Champion – (former) Councillor Bob McShee

Older Persons' Champion - Councillor Maddy Redpath

"Over the course of the past year, I have been actively engaged in addressing a multitude of issues pertaining to the senior residents within our community, focusing on enhancing accessibility, facilitating engaging activities, domestic issues and transport problems. I have also continued in my position as a trustee at Merrow Sunset Homes, an endeavour that has proven to be both interesting and rewarding.

The majority of individuals who sought my assistance had resorted to reaching out to me directly after exhausting other channels. They had found my details on the Councillor's page on the GBC website where "Older Persons' Champion" is clearly displayed. In future it would be useful to have the position more widely advertised among our residents as well as relevant groups, such as Age UK and U3A, ensuring greater visibility and accessibility to those in need. The position also could be improved by having a more defined remit of responsibilities and structure, including regularly scheduled meetings with officers and relevant lead members. This strategic approach would greatly enhance visibility and accessibility, ultimately enabling us to better serve those in need.

Despite encountering various challenges along the way, my tenure as the Older Persons' Champion has been immensely fulfilling. I have found great

satisfaction in serving the interests and welfare of our senior community members. I extend my sincerest wishes of good luck to the next Older Persons' Champion."

Voting on contested elections:

Under Council Procedure Rule 29 (a), where two candidates are nominated for election as committee chairman or vice-chairman, the election shall be determined by way of a show of hands.

If there are more than two candidates nominated, a show of hands will be taken for each candidate. If there is not a clear majority in favour of one person, then the name of the person with the least number of votes will be taken off the list and a new vote taken. The process will continue until there is a majority of votes for one person. However, if after this process, two candidates are still tied, the election shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

Appointment of Honorary Freeman

Recommendation to Council:

To consider the nomination of former councillor David Goodwin for appointment as an Honorary Freeman and, if so minded, to agree to convene a special meeting of the Council on Thursday 1 June 2023 at 7pm at the Guildhall for the purpose of conferring upon him the title of Honorary Freeman.

Reason for recommendation:

To recognise formally David Goodwin's eminent and distinguished service to the Borough of Guildford.

Is the report (or part of it) exempt from publication? No

1. Background

1.1 Under the provisions of Section 249 of the Local Government Act 1972, the Council may, by resolutions passed by not less than two-thirds of the councillors voting thereon at a meeting specially convened for the purpose admit to be Honorary Freemen of the Borough persons of distinction and persons who have, in the opinion of the Council, rendered eminent service to the Borough.

1.2 The Council, at its meeting on 10 April 2014, adopted a "Protocol on the appointment, role, status, rights and obligations of Honorary Freemen and Honorary Aldermen". The Protocol was subsequently reviewed and amended by the Council on 5 October 2021. The procedures set out in this report comply fully with the amended Protocol.

2. Honorary Freemen of the Borough

- 2.1 Since the 1974 re-organisation of local government, the Council has bestowed the office of Honorary Freeman upon the following persons:
 - The Right Honourable the Lord Nugent of Guildford (12 June 1985)
 - Mr Bill Bellerby MBE (25 March 1995)
 - Mrs Doreen Bellerby MBE (25 March 1995)
 - Mr David Watts (1 October 2003)
 - Mr Andrew Hodges (22 November 2011)
 - Mrs Jennifer Powell (3 November 2015)
 - Mr Keith Churchouse (1 December 2022)
- 2.2 In addition, the Council bestowed the freedom the Borough on the former Women's Royal Army Corps in 1988, and the Army Training Centre (Pirbright) in 2017.
- 2.3 Under the adopted Protocol (as amended), a person shall be deemed eligible for appointment as an honorary freeman provided that they meet all of the following requirements:

"The person shall:

- be a person of distinction
- have given eminent service to the borough during that period.

"Eminent service" in this context includes but is not limited to any of the following:

 public service (including past distinguished service as a councillor or officer of the Council)

- o artistic and/or cultural endeavours
- o business, economic growth and prosperity
- charitable work
- o improvement to the built and natural environment
- political activities
- religious and spiritual life
- sporting activities
- have a strong and continuing connection with and commitment to the borough of Guildford, or have made a major contribution to national life and in doing so have enhanced the reputation of the borough."

3. Nomination received for appointment of Honorary Freeman

- 3.1 In accordance with the Council's adopted Protocol, Councillor Fiona White has proposed, and Councillor Julia McShane seconded, the nomination of former councillor David Goodwin for appointment as an Honorary Freeman of the Borough, in the light of his eminent and distinguished service to the Borough, full details of which are set out in the nomination attached as **Appendix 1**.
- 3.2 Mr Goodwin has indicated that he would be delighted to accept the appointment. Mr Goodwin stood down as a borough councillor at the May 2023 Borough Council elections due to his ongoing serious health issues.

4. Financial Implications

- 4.1 There will be a need to purchase a Scroll of Freedom, which will cost in the region of £450. This, together with the cost of providing a finger buffet/drinks reception for guests following the special meeting in honour of the new Honorary Freeman, would cost in total approximately £2,500. The cost can be met from the Civic Support budget.
- 4.2 The incidental costs of staging a special meeting of the Council at the Guildhall can be met from within existing budgets.

5. Legal Implications

- As stated above, in order to confer the title of Honorary Freeman on anyone, the Local Government Act 1972 requires the Council to adopt a resolution passed by not less than two-thirds of the councillors voting thereon at a meeting specially convened for the purpose.
- 5.2 Under the amended Protocol, any nomination received for appointment as Honorary Freemen shall provide evidence that the person nominated:
 - (i) meets the eligibility requirements referred to in paragraph 2.3 above, and
 - (ii) will accept the appointment

Mr. Goodwin has indicated that he would be delighted to have the title of Honorary Freeman of the Borough conferred upon him.

Appointment of Honorary Freeman

Nomination

We wish to nominate former councillor David John Goodwin as an Honorary Freeman of the Borough. We consider that he meets the criteria because of his long service to the borough and the people of Guildford which is evidenced by his service as a borough councillor for a total of 24 years (i.e. 6 consecutive council terms). He was a councillor for the former Friary & St Nicolas Ward for the first 16 years and then represented Onslow Ward for the following 8 years.

He was a member of the Licensing Committee for the whole 24-year period and chaired that Committee for the last 4 years. He was also a designated Licensing Sub-Committee chairman from 2007 to 2023. He served as a member of the Planning Committee for 17 years, and was a member of the Guildford Joint Committee (formerly the Guildford Local Committee) until the summer of 2022 when he was its Vice-Chairman.

David also served a year on the Council's Executive in 2019-20 as the Lead Councillor for Waste, Licensing, and Parking.

In addition to his service as a borough councillor, David was the County Councillor at Surrey for a period of 16 years. His division covered the area comprising the former Friary & St Nicolas and Onslow Wards. As their county councillor, David worked with the Wodeland Action Group for 10 years before Surrey County Council and the police agreed to introduce one of the first 20mph zones in Guildford Town, adding to the safety of local residents.

Outside the formal council setting, David was the borough council's representative at Hillier House (an almshouse for ladies of a certain age) for 20 years and then continued as a Trustee of the charity in a personal capacity.

From 2000, David was also a member of the Taxi Advisory Group for 13 years and a member of the Town Centre Licensing Forum for 7 years. He was also a governor of St Nicolas Infants School for four years. David was also one of the Council's representatives on the Guildford/Freiburg Association for a total of 11 years.

We believe that his service to the borough and community makes him a person of distinction who has given eminent service to the borough for a substantial period who has had and still has a strong and continuing connection with the borough of Guildford.

We confirm that David will be willing to accept the Nomination if it is agreed by the Council.
