### 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 (the 2003 Act) requires the Council (as licensing authority) to carry out its various licensing functions to promote the following four licensing objectives:
  - (1) the prevention of crime and disorder;
  - (2) public safety;
  - (3) the prevention of public nuisance;
  - (4) the protection of children from harm.
- 1.2 The 2003 Act further requires the Council to publish a 'Statement of Licensing Policy' that sets out the policies the Council will generally apply to promote the licensing objectives when making decisions on applications made under the Act. The current Statement of Licensing Policy took effect on the 7 January 2016.
- 1.3 Under the 2003 Act, it is the duty of all licensing authorities, in carrying out their functions, to have regard to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. As long as the licensing authority has properly understood and considered the Guidance, it may depart from it when it has reason to do so. However, as the licensing authority is under a duty to have regard to the Guidance, it will need to give full reasons for its departure from it. This would be a key consideration for the courts should departure from the Guidance result in a determination, which gives rise to an appeal or judicial review.
- 1.4 Temporary event notices allow licensable activities to be carried on without the need for a premises licence. If a premises has a premises licence, they allow licensable activities to be carried on otherwise than in accordance with the licence. They can therefore allow different activities or different hours. Events carried on under the authority of a temporary event notice are not subject to the conditions on the premises licence, however any conditions imposed on the temporary event licence must be in line with the premises licence.

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### 2. SITE LOCATION AND HISTORY

- 2.1 Worplesdon Place Hotel is located at Perry Hill, Worplesdon, Surrey, GU3 3RY.
- 2.2 There are residential properties in the immediate vicinity of the premises. A plan showing the location of the premises is attached at Appendix 1, with residential properties represented by a dot.
- 2.3 In October 2015, the current licence holder transferred the licence and took possession of the premises.
- 2.4 The current premises licence, GUPLA0209, permits the sale of alcohol (for consumption on and off the premises) and regulated entertainment indoors until 00:30 hours Monday to Sunday. A copy of the licence is attached at Appendix 2.

### 3. APPLICATION

- 3.1 A Temporary Event Notice was submitted by Mr Graham Rolland on Wednesday 27 May 2016 and the form is attached at Appendix 3. This notification was submitted within the correct time periods and has been accepted as a valid notice.
- 3.2 The dates and times shown on the Notice are as follows:

Saturday 6 August 2016 from 12:00 hours to 00:00 hours (midnight)

The licensable activities notified on the application are:

a) the provision of regulated entertainment

The proposed event is a large film viewing via a big external screen.

The premises are currently not licensed for these activities outdoors.

- 3.3 On 2 June 2016, Environmental Health served a notice of objection in relation to the temporary event notice. This notice was served within the timescales prescribed.
- 3.4 The objection is based on their concern that the 'prevention of public nuisance' licensing objective would not be met. The objection notice refers to 11 complaints from residents following a recent three day event at the premises. A full copy of the objection notice is attached at Appendix 4.

### 4. CONSIDERING THE OBJECTION

- 4.1 The factors to be taken into account when considering the objection are listed below:
  - (a) The Sub-Committee is obliged to consider this objection with a view to promoting the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance.
  - (b) The Sub-Committee must have regard to any representations made by Environmental Health and the applicant and any supporting evidence.
  - (c) The Sub-Committee must, having regard to the objection notice, give a counter notice under Section 105 of the Act if it considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance to do so. If a counter notice is given, the event is not authorised to take place.
  - (d) If the Sub-Committee does not consider it appropriate to give a counter notice under Section 105, it may impose conditions on the TEN if it considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objective of the prevention of public Page 2

nuisance to do so. The conditions that can be imposed are any which are on the existing premises licence, provided they are not inconsistent with the carrying out of the event.

- (e) If the Sub-Committee does not consider it appropriate to give a counter notice or impose conditions, the premises user will be entitled to hold the event as stated in the notice.
- (f) If the Sub-Committee decides to give a counter notice it must give the counter notice and a notice stating the reasons for the decision to the premises user and Environmental Health. If the Sub-Committee decides to impose conditions it must give notice to the premises user together with a separate statement of conditions and provide a copy to Environmental Health.
- (g) There is a right of appeal to the Magistrate's Court for the recipient of a counter notice or for Environmental Health where no counter notice is given, however no appeal may be brought later than 5 working days before the event period begins.

### 5. LICENSING POLICY

  - Section 12.4 The Licensing Objectives Prevention of nuisance

  - Paragraphs 7.1 to 7.40 Temporary Event Notices.

### 7. RECOMMENDATION

7.1 The Sub-Committee is asked to consider the objection notice from Environmental Health, together with any other submissions made at the hearing, and determine whether it is appropriate for the promotion of the prevention of public nuisance objective to give a counter notice which will prevent the event from going ahead or whether to impose conditions from the existing premises licence on the event.



### **MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

#### A: Sales of alcohol

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
  - a. at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b. at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

### **Mandatory Licensing Conditions (Alcohol Sales)**

- 1.1 The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- 1.2 In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
  - a. games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
    - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a
    group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing
    objective;
  - provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - d. selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
  - e. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3.1 The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 3.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- 3.3 The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
  - a. a holographic mark, or
  - b. an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that
  - a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
    - i. beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - iii still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
  - b. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the

premises; and

c. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

#### **B: Permitted price for alcohol**

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
  - a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
  - b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- c) relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
  - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### C: Film exhibitions

- a) Subject to subsection (b) below, the admission of children to the exhibition of films on the premises shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC)
- b) If the licensing authority does not agree with the category of any film as recommended by the BBFC, it may alter the category of the film. On notice of alteration of category being given by the licensing authority to the holder of the licence, the film shall thereafter be treated as being in the altered category and admission of children to the exhibition of the film shall be restricted accordingly

a. Variations from these times displayed on licence:

Christmas Day: 11:30 to 22:30

New Years Eve: 10:00 to New Years Day terminal hour.

Residents of the hotel shall be permitted to purchase alcohol for themselves and their 'Bone Fide' guests, at all times, which includes the period outside permitted hours.

#### E: Further Conditions agreed with Environmental Health (Pollution Control) 13 February 2006

- All Public Entertainment, to which the licence applies, shall be restricted to within the buildings of the premises. No loud speakers external to the building providing amplified music shall be permitted.
- 2. External windows and doors serving the licensed area shall be kept shut at all times when public entertainment is being provided. Doors may be opened for normal entrance and egress of people but must be shut immediately thereafter and must be fitted with self-closers, which shall be maintained in good working order, which shall ensure this. Noise from the closing of doors shall not be audible beyond the site boundary.
- 3. The Licensee shall arrange to carry out regular monitoring checks at the site boundary of the licensed premises during any entertainment permitted by this licence. If any noise breakout is determined which is clearly audible at any nearby noise sensitive premises, then the licensee shall act to identify the cause and take such action as necessary to reduce the noise breakout from the building.
- Customers shall not be permitted to use any external part of the premises, e.g. outside drinking areas, for any purposes
  after 11:30 pm except for access to and from the premises.
- 5. Measures should be taken to ensure that noxious smells from the licensed premises are not permitted so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 6. Measures to be taken to not "over-light" the extended patio area. Ensure that the lighting is aimed away from sensitive premises, and use properly designed screens, baffles, hoods and louvres to control the beam. The lighting should be turned off when the patio area is closed.

Notification has been received by Environmental Health that Worplesdon Place Hotel, Perry Hill, Worplesdon, Surrey, GU3 3RY has submitted a TEN application for 6 August 2016: times 1200 - 0000; The provision of regulated entertainment; 300 max in attendance; event described as "Open Air Cinema".

Environmental Health object to this application on the grounds that it would undermine the licensing objective of prevention of public nuisance.

The evidence to support this objection is that:

- A recent 3 day event was held at Worplesdon Place Hotel over the Bank Holiday weekend, entitled "Spring Family Festival", involving a BBQ, pony rides, face-painting, a children's play area and live music in the gardens of the hotel, from 12pm to 5pm on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> May, Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> May and Monday 30<sup>th</sup> May. To date Environmental Health have received 11 separate complaints from residents of Worplesdon regarding noise from the event, many of whom were significantly affected in their properties, with some having to stay indoors and close windows to avoid the noise, one of whom left the area on Monday to avoid the noise.
- The management of the hotel were contacted about the noise over the weekend by residents, but this does not appear to have any effect on the levels of noise from the event.
- There was no prior notification of the event to residents.
- Due to the timing of the bank holiday event and prior commitments, it has not been possible to discuss at length the complaints with the management, though a meeting has been arranged for Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> June to visit the venue for this purpose.
- Although evidence to support a statutory nuisance has not been proven at this stage, due to the limited time of the event, the investigation is at its early stage. The number of complaints for one events is sizeable and a future event in the gardens would likely cause a nuisance to local residents.

For these reasons, Environmental Health are satisfied that the granting of this TEN would undermine the licensing objective of preventing public nuisance. A copy of this objection notice will be served on Surrey Police Licensing, in accordance with the legislation.
