Proposal:	The premises is a public house located in the town centre. The application is to vary the authorised plans attached to the licence to allow a pop-up bar to be located on the rear terrace, and to replace the conditions attached to the licence. All licensable activities and authorised hours to remain unaltered.		

1. <u>SITE LOCATION</u>

1.1 The premises is a public house situated on the edge of the town centre. There are mainly residential properties with some commercial properties in the vicinity. A site location map is attached as **Appendix 1**. The dots on the map indicate residential properties.

2. LICENCE HISTORY

- 2.1 The current premises licence GUPLA0296 and the authorised plans are attached as **Appendix 2**.
- 2.2 The licence commenced on 24 November 2005, and was transferred to the current licence holder on 2 February 2017.
- 2.3 The designated premises supervisor (DPS) has been varied twice since the licence was first granted. The current DPS has been named on the licence since 7 March 2017.
- 2.4 The authorised plans attached to the licence were varied by means of a minor variation, which took effect from 10 May 2017. There have been no changes to the hours or conditions since the licence first commenced on 24 November 2005

3. APPLICATION

The application form, a copy of which is attached as **Appendix 3**, gives the following information in relation to the variation proposal.

3.1 Proposed hours and licensable activities:

There is no change to the proposed licensable activities or the authorised hours as set out on the current premises licence.

3.2 Conditions

- 3.2.1 The applicant has proposed replacing the existing conditions with the conditions set out in the application form. Where appropriate we have tried to convert these into the following enforceable conditions.
 - All staff shall be suitably trained for their job function for the premises. A record of this training, which will include regular refresher training, shall be maintained by the licence holder and made available, on request, to an authorised officer of a responsible authority.
 - 2. The premise licence holder shall ensure that the Designated Premises Supervisor, or in his/her absence another responsible person, keeps a 'Refusal and Incident Report Register', in which full details of all incidents are recorded. This shall be completed as soon as possible after the incident. The time and date of both the incident and when the report was completed, and by whom, is to form part of the entry. The register is to be kept on the premises at all times and shall be produced to an authorised officer of a responsible authority when required.
 - 3. The premises licence holder or their nominated person shall ensure that they engage with any local operating Pub Watch or similar scheme.
 - 4. All staff shall be aware of the law regarding the refusal of service to any person who is drunk or is underage and shall be aware of how to seek ID from anyone who appears to be underage. This shall form part of the staff training record maintained by the premises licence holder.
 - 5. Except for access and egress, doors and windows shall be kept closed whenever regulated entertainment is provided or after 23:30 hours in any event.
 - 6. During regulated entertainment, noise levels shall be monitored at regular intervals determined by the licence holder. If unreasonable noise disturbance is witnessed, action will be taken to reduce noise levels. A record of this monitoring and any action taken shall be kept on the premises and made available, on request, to an authorised officer of a responsible authority.
 - 7. Where possible, live music instruments shall be channelled through the premises permanent music system with regular external sound checks and a volume override behind the bar to be controlled by the duty manager.
 - 8. Prominent signage shall be displayed at the premises, reminding customers to leave the premises quietly and respect the neighbours.
 - No disposal of waste/glass bottles, which is audible from beyond the site boundary, shall be carried out at the premises between 23:00 hours and 07:00 hours. This shall particularly include emptying bottle bins into waste and recycling containers.
 - 10. No consumption of food or drink is permitted outdoors after 23:30 hours, save for on the rear balcony where customers are permitted to consume food and drink until the premises closes. Notices will be displayed to this effect.
 - 11. A portable/pop up bar can be erected on the balcony. This temporary bar will close to customers at 23:00 hours.

- 12. Children are permitted on the premises until 21:00 hours unless partaking in a sit down meal or attending a private function where they are permitted on the premises until their meal or the function finishes
- 13. Children are only permitted on the premises if accompanied by an adult.
- 14. The premises shall operate a challenge 21 age verification policy. Staff shall be trained in this policy and recorded in the staff training record. This policy shall be actively promoted and shall state that any person to whom the sale or supply of alcohol is being made, who looks or appears to be under the age of 21 shall be asked to provide identification that they are 18 years of age or over. The following forms of identification are acceptable: (a) Passport; (b) Photo driving licence; (c) PASS accredited holographic proof of age card; or (d) Any other form of identification agreed with the Police. Signs promoting this policy shall be prominently displayed at all entrances and the alcohol sales areas.
- 3.2.2 Any conditions which relate to live music or recorded music are suspended between the hours of 08:00 and 23:00 on the same day provided the premises are open for the purposes of being used for the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises, and if the music is amplified, it takes place before an audience of no more than 500 people. The only way a condition can be enforced between 08:00 and 23:00 is if it has been amended during a review of the premises licence to state that section 177A of the Licensing Act 2003 does not apply to it.
- 3.2.3 Proposed conditions 5, 6 and 7 listed in 3.2.1 above, the existing conditions relating to live and recorded music (if the Sub-Committee declines to remove them) and any amended conditions imposed by the Sub-Committee would therefore only apply and be enforceable for live music after 23:00 on Friday and Saturday, and for recorded music after 23:00 Monday to Sunday, unless there were more than 500 people in the audience.

3.3 Authorised Plan

The proposal is to change the layout of the premises, to permit the installation of a temporary, pop up bar. As a result of this, the licensable area has been extended.

4. CONSULTATIONS

(i) Consultation period

The application was in consultation from 2 December to 29 December 2017. The application was advertised in accordance with the regulations.

(ii) Representations from Responsible Authorities

A representation was received from Environmental Health (Pollution Control) on the grounds of prevention of public nuisance. A copy of this representation is attached as **Appendix 4.**

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(iii) Representations from other persons

There were no representations from other persons.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

A: Sales of alcohol

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - a. at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b. at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

Mandatory Licensing Conditions (Alcohol Sales)

- 1.1 The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- 1.2 In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - a. games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b. provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - d. selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - e. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3.1 The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 3.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- 3.3 The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - a. a holographic mark, or
 - b. an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that
 - a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - i. beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

- b. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

B: Permitted price for alcohol

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- c) relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any
 member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the
 supply in question; and
- e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

C: Film exhibitions

- a) Subject to subsection (b) below, the admission of children to the exhibition of films on the premises shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC)
- b) If the licensing authority does not agree with the category of any film as recommended by the BBFC, it may alter the category of the film. On notice of alteration of category being given by the licensing authority to the holder of the licence, the film shall thereafter be treated as being in the altered category and admission of children to the exhibition of the film shall be restricted accordingly

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- There shall be no drinks promotions without prior notification to the Licensing Authority.
- Toughened glasses shall be used and regular collections shall be made from the bar area and terrace to prevent a build-up
- Inspections of the toilets shall be undertaken regularly and recorded.
- Adequate seating shall be provided both inside and outside.
- A 30 minute 'wind down' period shall be provided to allow customers to leave gradually and in a supervised manner.
- The pub manager shall be required to participate actively in and support the local Pubwatch scheme.
- Any off-sales shall be authorised by the Designated Premises Supervisor or duty manager, be completed before the end of the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol and be un-opened. Off-sales shall be refused if thought to be inappropriate.
- There shall be ongoing, in-house training for staff in respect of crime prevention, including drugs awareness.
- The assistant manager shall be required to obtain a personal licence.

Public Safety

- 10. There shall be full compliance with the Fire Precautions (Workplace) Regulations 1997 (as amended), including:
 - a. fire alarm testing;
 - b. display of fire evacuation procedure and appropriate staff training;
 - c. annual fire extinguisher inspection and PAT testing;
 - d. measures for gas and used oil storage;
 - automatic kitchen shut-down in the event of power failure to prevent gas leaks;
 - appropriate measures to reduce the risk of arson; and
 - regular liaison with the local Fire Officer.
- 11. Attendances at functions shall be limited to suitable numbers for the area allocated.
- 12. Free drinking water shall be available at all times.
- 13. There shall be full co-operation with Surrey Police.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 14. During the performance of live music:
 - a. all windows to the front of the premises (adjacent to Portsmouth Road) shall be kept shut and the front door will not
 - it shall be channelled through the premises permanent music system (where possible), with regular external sound checks and a volume override behind the bar to be controlled by the duty manager.
- 15. No external speakers shall be installed in the rear terrace area.
- 16. Customers shall not be permitted to loiter either on the rear terrace or at the front of the pub at closing time and staff shall be trained to move customers on.
- 17. Last orders shall be called 15 minutes prior to closing time.
- 18. Delivery arrangements shall be made to prevent nuisance.

Notification has been received by Environmental Health that Punch Taverns Limited has submitted an application to vary the licence GUPLA0296 for The Cannon, 3 Portsmouth Road, Guildford, GU2 4BL. The application is to change the layout of the premises, to permit the installation of a temporary, pop up bar, and to remove and replace the existing conditions.

Environmental Health object to this application on the grounds that it would undermine the licensing objective of 'The prevention of public nuisance'.

The evidence to support this objection is that:

- On 15/03/2017 a complaint was received related to noise outbreak from amplified music from the rear of the premises, from 'Soul & Funk' nights in March, April & May. The premises was added to the Out of Hours noise patrol and noise breakout from the internal area was identified to the rear of the premises when the rear doors were opened to allow ingress & egress of customers to the balcony/smoking area on multiple occasions when officers were on duty. In addition, officers identified there was noise generated from people using the balcony area for drinking and smoking.
- On 10/07/2017 a further complaint was received related to noise outbreak from amplified music and patrons shouting to the front of the premises between 9pm and 1am. The complainant advised that the issue was significant since The Keystone became The Cannon. The premises was again added to the Out of Hours noise patrol.
- Addition of a pop-up bar would add to the number of patrons on the external balcony area and necessarily increase the noise from this area.

The variation to the conditions also removes the requirement to not have external speakers to be installed in the rear terrace area, removes the requirement to not have live music outside the buildings of the premises after 10.30pm, removes the limit of number of performers of live music and also removes the requirement to have doors fitted with self-closers and for these to be maintained in proper working order. Finally the variation to the conditions removes the requirement to not use any external part of the premises for any purpose after 11.30pm, except for access to and from the premises. Explicitly the new conditions would permit consumption of food and drink and smoking on the balcony area until 1.30am on Friday and Saturdays and 12.30am on other days of the week.

For these reasons, Environmental Health are satisfied that the granting of this variation would undermine the licensing objective of preventing public nuisance. A copy of this objection notice will be served on Surrey Police Licensing, in accordance with the legislation.
