Re- Application for Temporary Event Notice at Delta Force Paint Ball site.

Surrey Police concerns relating to the licensing objectives maybe undermined by the event going ahead.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder: -

There are concerns that if 450 people that could attend, without suitable numbers of security (not stated) the potential for high levels of intoxication violence and Anti-social Behaviour taking place which would result in requiring police attendance.

Our licensing officer having spoken to the applicant for this event it is to be advertised on social media (pre-ticket sales) there is a potential for people to attend with without tickets or access the site by climbing over the perimeter fence thus increasing attending numbers.

There is also the issue of people attending bringing in their own alcohol this would increase the potential for levels of intoxication amongst those attending.

There is also the concern around drug use / supply an issue common at this type of event.

In relation to ticket sales if they are purchased online prior to the event our concerns that under 18s could purchase tickets.

Public Safety: -

There are also concerns re traffic management with access and exiting from the location.

There are concerns in relation to no mention of medical cover and how injuries, levels of intoxication would be dealt with.

The site is directly on a national speed limit country road with no lighting and no pavement, if persons were to walk from Effingham railway station this would be considered very dangerous.
