3	The appointment of review boards under regulations under Section 34(4) (determination of claims and reviews) of the Social Security Act 1998.	Leader/Executive	
4	Any function relating to contaminated land	Leader/Executive	
5	The discharge of any function relating to the control of pollution or the management of air quality.	Leader/Executive	
6	The service of an abatement notice in respect of a statutory nuisance.	Leader/Executive	
7	The passing of a resolution that Schedule 2 to the Noise and Statutory Nuisance Act 1993 should apply in the Borough.	Leader/Executive	
8	The inspection of the Borough to detect any statutory nuisance.	Leader/Executive	
9	The investigation of any complaint as to the existence of a statutory nuisance.	Leader/Executive	
10	The obtaining of information under Section 330 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as to interests in land.	Leader/Executive
